

The Budget of the U.S. Information Agency

WHEREAS the U.S. Information Agency has used the taxpayers' money to promote the one-world movement of the United Nations organization;

And WHEREAS the violation of the constitutional principle of the separation of Church and State has employed religious personnel approved by the National Council of Churches;

And WHEREAS under the leadership of such personnel the agency has disseminated, at taxpayers expense, printed material of the National and World Councils of Churches advocating the ecumenical philosophy of said Councils;

And WHEREAS through the Voice of America the USIA has praised and lauded Mohammedanism throughout the world;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we, the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches in 25th Annual Convention assembled in Grand Rapids, Michigan, May 13-17, 1957, commend the Senate and House of Representatives for their \$54 million cut in the proposed budget of the USIA as a step in the right direction, and for their resistance to the pressure of Congressional and religious "liberals" who would use the said Agency to further their own pet philosophies,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the proper Congressional Committees.
