WHEREAS the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches is a Fellowship of Bible-believing Baptists which seeks to honor Jesus Christ as the only Savior from sin and the Sovereign Lord of the universe, we view with grave concern the ever increasing trend to blaspheme the name of Christ and view His sacrificial work on the cross with ridicule; and

WHEREAS one of the most recent illustrations of this attitude toward Him is evidenced by the film "Parable" presented by the Protestant Council of the City of New York, which depicts Jesus Christ as a clown riding behind a circus parade on a white donkey and being raised to the top of a circus tent to die in seeming mockery of the crucifixion; and

WHEREAS this sacrilegious film will be shown to thousands of visitors to the New York World's Fair at the Protestant and Orthodox Center, even though the use of this film has been protested by Mr. Robert Moses, the director of the Fair;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, assembled at Winona Lake, Indiana, June 21–26, 1964, repudiates this disgraceful and blasphemous portrayal of the life and death of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
