Neo-Evangelicalism

BE IT RESOLVED that the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, meeting in Annual Conference at the Civic Auditorium in Grand Rapids, Michigan, June 20–24, 1966, go on record as reaffirming its belief in the Bible and its own testimony of total inerrancy and therefore absolute authority in all matters upon which it pronounces.
