Racial Hostility

WHEREAS there have been renewed hostilities in the United States between races, as evidenced by increased activities of neo-Nazis and the Ku Klux Klan; and

WHEREAS anti-Semitism erupts periodically, inspired by a world system that holds deep and often unrecognized antipathy toward Jews, the national people of God's choice; and

WHEREAS problems in our society such as crime and poverty are not rooted in any particular race or races, but find their cause in sin; and

WHEREAS God has made all human beings from one couple (Genesis 1:26–28; Acts 17:26); the blessing of God has come upon all humanity through Abraham and His Seed, the Lord Jesus Christ (Genesis 12:1–3; Galatians 3:14–16); and Christians look forward to spending eternity with brothers and sisters in Christ from every kindred, tongue, people and nation (Revelation 5:9);

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that we, the messengers of the churches in fellowship with the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, meeting for our $61^{\rm st}$ Annual Conference in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on June 22–26, 1992, repudiate all racial hatred; that we recommit ourselves to the spread of the gospel among all races, which presupposes an attitude of unconditional love, compassion and self-sacrifice; that we encourage fellowship among believers without regard for race, color or nationality; and that in our homes and churches we proclaim and demonstrate the value of each individual, regardless of race, color or nationality.
